### **Breve descrizione**

The "EU Space Policy, International Law and Sustainability" (EUSPIL) proposal addresses EU studies, specifically referring to the teaching, learning and research about the EU space law and policy and its adherence to international space regulatory frameworks. EUSPIL contributes to spreading knowledge about how the EU space action is benefiting the daily lives of citizens in Europe and abroad. It also enhances the EU visibility as a leading space actor in tackling sustainable development goals through its action. This proposal aims at developing a 42-hour course on EU space law and policy to be taught within the Master Degree programme in “European Union, Global Processes and Sustainability” at the Department of Political Sciences (University of Pisa, IT), together with a Training School and three cycles of seminars open to participants from outside the University. A Final Conference will be also organized involving academics and stakeholders. Accordingly, EUSPIL has four specific objectives that blend educational enrichment: 1. Educate future leaders, i.e. the next generation of lawyers and policymakers on the EU space law and policy framework and its implementation; 2. Inform stakeholders, i.e. government officials, space industry and armed forces as well as the civil society and the media on how to enhance European value-based space action for a secure, safe and sustainable use of outer space; 3. Empower EU policymakers with the necessary knowledge for effectively enforcing the EU value-based space action; 4. Initiate global dialogue regarding the imperative for embedding sustainability strategies for ensuring access to space for the future. Target groups include the scientific community, university students, stakeholders, the civil society and the media. Expected results include the first ever course entirely devoted to EU space law and policy as well as publishing leading essays which will guide research policy action in this field for the coming years.
